Introducing the Puppy Pal Program

Become a Puppy Pal by symbolically adopting a Dog Guides' Litter.

Every puppy is born with the potential to become a future Dog Guide, and we want to give them the best start possible. For a donation of \$10,000, you can make a huge impact by helping to cover expenses such as:

1. Breeding and Genetics:

- Cost of breeding high-quality, genetically sound dogs suitable for service work.
- Genetic testing and screening to ensure the health and suitability of the parent dogs.

2. Puppy Care and Socialization:

- Veterinary care including vaccinations, deworming, and health checkups for the litter.
- Food and nutrition tailored for the specific needs of growing puppies.
- Housing and facilities to provide a safe and comfortable environment for the puppies.
- Early socialization experiences to prepare them for their future roles as service dogs.

3. Basic Training and Development:

- Training materials and resources for basic obedience and socialization training.
- Puppy staff to guide Volunteer Foster Families with their puppies through their early training stages.
- Equipment such as leashes, collars, puppy vests and crates

4. Health and Wellness:


- Continued veterinary care as the puppies grow and develop.
- Monitoring and management of any health issues or concerns that may arise during the training process.

As a Puppy Pal, you will receive:

- A Certificate of Adoption accompanied by a photo and information about the litter
- An update at about 16 months on where the dogs are and what they're doing

When choosing to adopt please know:

- You cannot name the puppies
- You cannot choose the litter
- Litter size can vary
- Not all puppies graduate and are successful, and that's okay. Through our Career Change program, they will find a home and go on to live wonderful, meaningful lives bringing joy to their family

The Fellowships and Memberships program is loved by Lions across the country and has a special place in our hearts at LFCDG. Some important tips and reminders to keep it running smoothly, properly, and ensure all regulatory requirements are met.

Following CRA guidelines and upholding proper financial policies and practices is critical and essential for us at Dog Guides. As such please remember:

- It is necessary to indicate on cheques that the funds are for the purchase of a Fellowship or Membership, so we direct them accordingly. It is extremely difficult to go back and change where the funding is allocated.
- We strongly encourage that you send the full payment and recipient(s) together or use the balances within the same fiscal year (July-June)
- We use a third-party provider so please allow for 4 to 6 weeks delivery from the time the order is received


Stephanie and Essie

"She gives me peace of mind, knowing that if I fall, I can ask her to bark for help and get assistance. I really don't know how safe I'd feel without her," says Stephanie.

Essie also helps Stephanie by picking up dropped items, mostly around her apartment. "She'll proudly pick up the same item, even if I have dropped it 100 times that day."

"To me, she's not just a dog; she's my super dog because I know she allows me to have an independent life."

Because of Essie, Stephanie is able to live on her own and go out in public without having to rely on anybody. Service dog guides allow others to have increased independence and freedom. Construction Update

Construction on the new school is underway with the concrete foundation progressing quickly! LFCDG's future is starting to take shape as the footprint of the new school is now clear. Make sure to check LFCDG's emails for every update on the new national training school.



Helping More Canadians

The new national training school will offer the dedicated space and resources needed to make more Dog Guide teams possible. Currently, all 7 training programs must share LFCDG's limited and inaccessible space with each other.

One highlight of increased efficiency in the new school is in the Diabetes Alert Dog Guide (DAD) training program. In LFCDG's current space, the DAD team is spread out over several areas of the school making it time-consuming to transport dogs and materials. In the new training school, DAD program rooms will be connected, offering quick access to all necessary resources. In addition to a classroom and training room, the DAD program will also have purpose-built scent training and scent preparation areas to further streamline training.
