If you or someone you know is looking to be matched with a trained Diabetes Alert Dog, now is the perfect time to sign up. Diabetes Alert Dog Guides are trained to assist Canadians (16 years or older) diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness by providing specific tasks and advanced scent work. These Dog Guides are trained to detect sudden drops in their handler's blood sugar and alert them. Take the first step toward having a life-changing companion by your side!

Additionally, if you or someone you know is between 5-16 years old with Type 1 diabetes and lives within 2 hours of Oakville, we invite you to reach out to our client services department for more details on eligibility for our new pilot program.

The Difference a New State-of-the-Art Training Space Makes!

A new national training school for Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is exciting in every aspect. From offering clients improved spaces to stay while they train with their Dog Guides to having expanded play and care areas for future Dog Guides, the new training school will allow for more Dog Guide matches to be made in a purpose-built facility.

A highlight of the new school is its increased training capacities, particularly with the construction of a mock streetscape. By creating a custom-built, indoor street complete with a variety of terrains, LFCDG will offer improved training experiences and efficiency. The streetscape will increase available space and lessen weather-dependency meaning training with real curbs and sidewalks can continue even if the weather outdoors would not allow it. This safe and controlled environment, located in the underground level of the new school, aims to improve the confidence, comfort, and security of clients and future Dog Guides while they are training.

In order to make ambitious spaces like this a reality, Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides launched the largest fundraising campaign in its history earlier this year.
